

As we wrapped up the meeting after much talk about what our students have missed since March of 2020, a student raised her hand to make one last point. In my book, that is a very valuable gain!

Although we only have two positive cases of COVID-19 this week, we still have a number of students on our remote learner list due to exposure to COVID-19. I would like to reiterate what all of us are hearing from scientists and medical professionals across the country - PLEASE ENCOURAGE YOUR DAUGHTER CONTINUE TO BE DILIGENT AND FOLLOW COVID-19 MITIGATION STRATEGIES. While the numbers may look a bit better, we are not out of the woods yet. Please encourage your daughter to wear a mask, social distance and PLEASE discourage in-person gatherings at this time.

Thank you for allowing us to partner with you in your daughter's Catholic education. Please know that you are in our prayers throughout this season of Lent.

EASTER BREAK TRAVEL INQUIRY



In our efforts to prepare safely to in-person learning after the Easter break, we are asking all Pandas to report any and all travel over the Easter break. Parents are asked to discuss travel plans with their daughters, so they are prepared to complete the form. Important information includes the following:

- Return date to NKY
- Travel to a state where the COVID-19 positivity rate is 15% or higher (CLICK HERE to access the states' positivity rates)

LENTEN OPPORTUNITIES


During the Lenten Season we encourage students to find ways that they can draw closer to God through Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving. Below are some opportunities that will be offered:

Prayer - A decade of the Rosary is prayed every Monday, Tuesday and Thursday at 7:40 a.m. in the chapel. Mass is held every Friday morning at 7:20 a.m. in the chapel. Reconciliation will be offered through Religion Classes on Wednesdays throughout Lent. Students are encouraged to wear Purple accessories/shirts with their uniforms on Wednesdays as a way to remind us of this prayerful season.

Fast - Students are encouraged to "give up" something during the Lenten Season - suggestions were shared in the student bulletin. Throughout Lent we will encourage students to fast from certain things for a day - for example - fast from gossip on Thursday, February 25. etc.

Almsgiving - Students are encouraged to find ways to give of their time and treasure in a way that benefits others. Whether that is through a service project or donating to one of our collections. We have a collection for GoPantry which ends on Friday, February 26. We will be taking part in the Rice Bowl Project this year as well. Rice Bowls were handed out in Religion classes last week and will be collected during Holy Week.







NDA FRESHMEN NEWS

After taking the CERT on Tuesday, Freshmen Pandas met with School Counselors to take a Career Cluster Assessment in Naviance to help them begin to identify the best possible fits for them with future careers. DRUG FREE CLUB

Over 200 of NDA's DFCA members are STILL considered "Unconfirmed Members" because they have not yet fully completed the submission of their test results from the Home Testing Kits. If your student has not yet received their Member ID card in the mail, they are probably an "Unconfirmed Member."

There is a simple fix for this! A parent/guardian must complete the simple test result form CLICK HERE FOR LINK to confirm with Drug Free Club that the student achieved a drug-free test using the Home Test Kit that was mailed to your home. To accomplish this, the Parent/Guardian needs the student's Drug Free Club ID Number, which can be found in 3 places: previous emails to parents from Drug Free Club, on the top left of the student's DFCA Member ID card from last year, or from Mrs. Hildreth.

As soon as this step is completed, club status will be updated, and the student will receive in the mail their personalized Club ID Card and the Key Tag for **Confirmed, Active Members!** A temporary ID card can immediately be printed upon completion of the form, and the student is then eligible for all of our rewards! **Contact Mrs. Hildreth with any questions.**

Alcohol is the most widely used substance amongst young people.

• 90% of alcoholic drinks consumed by teenagers are consumed through binge drinking. (For women 4 or more drinks in 2 hours; for men 5 or more drinks in 2 hours)

Why is this a big deal?

The adolescent brain is still developing, and won't finish until their mid-late 20's.

Alcohol can have a serious impact on ongoing brain development. Here's how:

- Alcohol can damage the part of a teen's brain responsible for memory and learning
- Teens that drink regularly have smaller *prefrontal lobes than teens who do not drink (*responsible for planning, judgement, decision making, impulse control)
- Alcohol is a depressant and actually causes the teen brain to slow down
 The safest option is for teenagers to delay drinking as long as possible.
 But...teenagers drink. So what can you as parents do about this?

Start having conversations.

In a recent survey given to many of our Drug Free Clubs members, it was revealed that *the number one topic our students have questions about is alcohol.* (I know, we were surprised too.) It was the "drug" they felt they knew the least about, despite being the one they statistically use the most.

Education is a powerful tool. Don't be afraid to start the conversation.
